She can do whatever she wants with her life.” These are brave words from a woman who lives in a community where child marriage was rampant until the Lutheran World Federation India (LWSI) program intervened in 2003.

Understanding that education was a key to the future for children in the village, the LWSI set up pre-primary education programs and trained members of the community to be program teachers. During the pre-primary classes, the children learn the alphabet and numbers, and enjoy drawing, singing, and playing together. The women of Rajdanga feel that the Pre-Primary Centers run by the LWF are a blessing, believing that “our children would never be admitted to the government schools without the pre-primary education.”
