Prayer petitions for Sundays follow the World Council of Churches Ecumenical Prayer Cycle and can be incorporated into the prayers at weekly worship. Weekday entries are offered as guides to prayer for the global, social and outreach ministries of the church. Thank you for your continued prayers for the life and mission of this church.

1 World AIDS Day

Pray for all people affected by HIV/AIDS, and for those who minister to them, including the AIDS Circle of Hope of North Texas, located in Wichita Falls.

2 International Day for the Abolition of Slavery

Pray for the ELCA Criminal Justice Task Force, that it may hear the cries of victims and perpetrators of crime, and may help the church understand how to respond with neighbor love.

3 International Day of Disabled Persons

Give thanks for Joyce Ebmeier, Tabitha Health Care Services, Lincoln, Neb., and other members of the task force preparing a statement on disability ministries for the ELCA to adopt at its 2011 Churchwide Assembly.

4 Thank God for the generosity of the 33 teachers, medical trainers, financial consultants and pastors who volunteered for three to 11 months through the ELCA Global Mission Volunteer program in 2010.

5 Second Sunday of Advent

God of the nations, we entrust to you the countries of Cape Verde, the Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, and Senegal. Give hope where hope is lacking, strength where there is weakness, and faith where it is sought.

6 Thank God for Robert Kasworm, serving the Machame Lutheran Hospital in Moshi, Tanzania. He is strengthening health care delivery by creating strategic alliances between Tanzanian and U.S.-based health providers.

7 Pray for continued strength for recent attendees at a Women of Color event held at the churchwide office as they go forth serving faithfully and as

they continue to remember and celebrate the ministries of women of color in the ELCA.

8 Pray for Trinity Deaf Congregation in Reading, Pa., as they mourn the sudden death of their pastor, the Rev. Jeanne Beadle. This congregation was recently lifted up in prayer in the May, 2010, issue of Prayer Ventures.

9 “All Are Welcome” reads the sign in front of Bethesda Lutheran Church, Ames, Iowa, signaling the way members go out of their way to extend a warm welcome to newcomers to the church, to their community and to this country. Give thanks for this faithful congregation.

10 Human Rights Day

Lift up Pastor Stephen Deal, who assists the ELCA in its accompaniment of churches throughout Central America. Pray for Martha Giron, Steve’s spouse, as she helps the Costa Rican Lutheran Church train women in arts and crafts and sewing so they can generate income for their families.

11 Pray for congregations in conflict, that they may learn to deal with difficult issues with patience, humility, and the skills of dialog and moral deliberation, and that they may remember that Christ makes them one.

12 Third Sunday of Advent

We pray, O God, for the people of Benin, Côte d’Ivoire, and Togo. Give strength especially to the churches as they witness to your peace and joy in the midst of great challenges and changes in their countries.

13 Give thanks for the “remarkable leadership” of the Rev. David Beckmann, ELCA pastor and president of Bread for the World, to mobilize citizens to advocate for public policies that help hungry people, as cited in the recent award of the World Food Prize.

14 Pray for Pastor Philip and Lou-Marie Knutson and family, who serve with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Southern Africa (ELCSA). Philip works as a resource person for the Lutheran Communion in Southern Africa’s Christian education program and as ELCA Global Mission regional program assistant for Southern Africa.

15 Lift up the ministries of Dan McDaniel, Ascension Lutheran Church, Riverside, Ill., and other church musicians, choir members and congregational staff who are preparing for the Christmas season, with all the additional work that brings to them.

16 Praise God for the ministry of presence that Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) provide throughout the world. Today we ask God to bless Sarah Bolick, Abby Farrand, David Kingsborough, Trena Montgomery, Janelle Neubauer, and Luke Paquin, young adults serving with the YAGM program in Jerusalem/West Bank.

23 Lift up in prayer Pastor Cheri Johnson and Divine Word/Pentecost Lutheran Church in the Washington Heights-Sherman Park neighborhood of Milwaukee as they reach out in their neighborhood that is diverse on many levels.
