

Mission Grant Letter of Intent



You have indicated interest in submitting a letter of intent to be considered for a covenant grant from the Deaconess Community. The Community desires to grant funds and enter into a covenant relationship with projects that fit the Community's mission and core values (see below).

Letters of intent are due to the Deaconess Community office by January 15.

The letter of intent is a snapshot of your proposal. In **one** page, please give a brief summary of your project. Remember, this is not yet a grant proposal. Basic questions to answer in your letter of intent include:

- What is the purpose of this project? What needs are being addressed?
- Whom will you serve?
- How much money will you be requesting? Is this a single year or a multi-year request? (Note: grants may be funded for up to three years. However, each year the grant will be reconsidered by the committee as part of the regular grant cycle)
- Is this an ongoing ministry or one that requires start-up assistance?
- With whom, if anyone, will you partner in this project?

The committee will consider letters of intent in early February and contact you promptly as to whether or not you will be invited to submit a full proposal. If invited, you will receive an outline of what your grant proposal is to include. Grant proposals will then be due by March 15.
